"Culture wars" NOT down to new generation of "snowflakes" or "social justice warriors"

- Evidence shows clear gaps between young and old on attitudes to race, immigration, gender equality and identity, sexuality etc - but NOT unusual gaps...
- ...constant ratio - youngest generation $2 x$ as likely to be comfortable with changing norms than oldest...

Final reflections

- Incredibly difficult to engage well on culture wars - BUT impossible to ignore: will keep coming back, and too important an issue for nation and universities
- Tension between generations not just natural, it's essential and beneficial - a type of "demographic metabolism" that prevents us becoming a "stagnant pond"
- Outright "culture wars" are different, in cause and effect: don't misdiagnose between period, lifecycle and cohort effects
- Stay optimistic: not unusually far apart, not paying as much attention to cultural division as may think...
- ...but need more focus on bringing us together, rather than exaggerating division
