




Demand for apprenticeships

UCAS Career Finder saw record 2.3m searches in 2021, up 41% from 2020

Of the 750,000 registered with UCAS for next year in the last 6 months 342,000 said they are interested in an apprenticeship


Despite this, the number of higher/degree apprenticeship starts for under 19s was 3,600 – just 4% of the total
