I am worried that I am not good enough or not ready for a good job as a graduate (Female 36% vs Male 19%) (Family university attendance, none = 36% sibling = 31% parents 28%).

Career confidence diminishes throughout study, with 33% of students saying they feel very confident about their career prospects during the first year of their course, dropping to 31% in year two – and to 17% in year three.

27% The biggest obstacle to my future careers success is not knowing what field to go into.
