






Entry rate across regions









# DID INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS TAKE THE PLACE OF UK STUDENTS?


Domicile as a proportion of acceptances







Projected percentage change between 2022 and 2030 (18 year olds)






#### **Possible disruptor analysis**
