Students contact PMs through drop in, bookable appointments, referral from academic tutors or module leaders, referral from other professional service teams, as well as those identified through data. We've worked very carefully on comms and materials so that students understand the relationships and staff understand the triage and referral.

This academic year, we started a new system of academic advisors in our medical school. Each advisor acts as a first point of contact for their 10 allocated medical students, and the students they are allocated come from all 5 years of the MBBS. Each student is meant to have 3 meetings a year with the advisor. We are trying to avoid any of hte students falling between the cracks Advisors receive some intital training and resources are posted on a Teams channel. If a student needs furhter support, they are refered to a senior tutor or to pastoral student support services. We needed 250 academic advisors from the faculty and they came with a range of experience and backgrounds. Feedback from advisors and students after the first year has been mixed so we are looking to tweak some aspects.

The Academic Coach role we have at University of Wolverhampton is very similar to the above discussion too as full-time personal tutors that aren't academics. As a WP institution it's allowed us to build meaningful relationships with students to understand and tailor support to their needs by working in

partnership with them. We're now over 6 years into the implementation of the role which has seen continued success in not just continuation and progression but areas such as sense of belonging and community.
