- Designed to teach transferrable communication skills – getting a message across in a short amount of time.



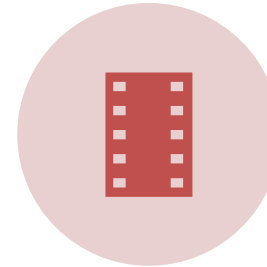
# Student Lawyer Project



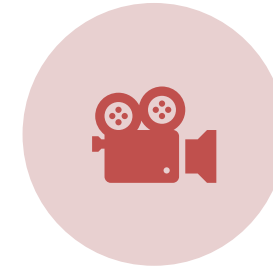
STUDENTS ARE TAKEN OUT OF USUAL TIMETABLED SESSIONS FOR ONE WEEK.

## ACCESS TO JUSTICE

### WHY IS IT SO IMPORTANT?

- In recent judgement the Supreme Court spilled out the importance of access to justice in context of court fees in employment cases. Given recent criticism of the courts media and policies designed to make it harder and more expensive of individuals to access the legal system.
- Growth of these claims has been very rapid, with over 250 million members of the competition class actions in the UK compared to 48 million in 2007.
- Access to justice is the fundamental right everyone has to receive a fair trial under the law. If someone can't access legal services then their rights are not able to be protected.
- In the UK's most Office scenario, for example, postmasters only received 2% of the £6 million settlement forcing the government to create an additional taxpayer funded compensation scheme.

## ACCESS TO JUSTICE

### Average cost of going to court and hiring lawyers in 2021 (excluding court costs)

**£20,000 - £30,000**

Further research done in 2017 shows that this would be the price for up to a 10% in court, which is 1 year to court would cost a single party up to **£200,000**

### HIDDEN FEES

## THE COST OF JUSTICE

### WHY IS THE JUSTICE SYSTEM EXPENSIVE?

- A large number of courts in the UK have been closed in the last decade and because of this the court system has become more expensive to use.
- The lower amount of courts in the UK has been there to have a direct link to the price of services and legal professionals who are higher demand which also increases the price of services further.
- Many cases are resolved when the court party avoid court cases have been the other way round.

### EXTERNAL FACTORS

- External factors like economic climate and methods to find customers, to pursue only recoverable costs, might reduce volume of cases.
- Economic climate, potentially leading to debt claims reducing in some areas (as credit less freely available but increasing in others, eg. mortgages where costs to customers are increasing and they are not able to pay their bills).
- Family solicitors saw the potential for increased use of mediation in children and financial cases following the proposed introduction of compulsory mediation and assessment meetings.

### WHAT SUPPORT IS AVAILABLE?

the legal aid agency is a publicly funded organisation that provides financial aid to individuals dealing with both **criminal and civil** cases allowing more accessible justice to the general public. Financial support is available to individuals with household disposable incomes under **£37,500** for crown court cases and **£22,325** for magistrates court cases.

this is available to deal with cases involving topics like:

- domestic violence
- family mediation
- discrimination
- breaches of human rights

law works is a UK charitable organisation aimed with providing free legal advice to individuals as well as other charities through volunteering schemes work done through 150 various law centres and law firms. **31,500** given legal advice in 2022. **180** non-profit organisations' cases supported. **>50** social welfare and professional skills training support provided.





## Other examples

- **21st Century Experiences:** students create promotional materials (e.g. poster and web page) for an event.
