Survey information

The data here is derived from student polling undertaken during November 2024 by Wonkhe and Cibyl as part of Belong.

The survey was distributed via WonkheSUs subscriber students' unions that have opted to take part in Belong, comprising students from 75 HE providers across the UK.


2,853 students gave responses to this wave, of which 1,461 were in work, and it is the responses of students in work reported here. The results are weighted to account for gender and level of study.

66 per cent of respondents were undergraduate and 34 per cent were postgraduate taught or research.

66 per cent of respondents were home-domiciled students and 34 per cent were international, including EU-domiciled.




Demographics: gender and age

The majority of students who are working are doing so to cover costs


Why did you get a job?

Students may live and work some distance from campus


What is your average travel to work time?


In what sector is your main/primary job?





Areas of work vary by gender


In what sector is your main/primary job?

Nearly half are on zero-hours contracts


What type of contract do you have?

How have you/would respond when costs increase?



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

Around a third struggle to balance work and study










Access to basic rights is not universal






Some sectors are worse offenders than others




One in five disagree their work is rewarding or helps their future
